

Information for Students Interested in International Research Exchange in Pharmacology

There are a number of suggested steps you should follow if interested in coming to do a research project here as part of your Program of study.

1. Choose a suitable research area in the Discipline you would like to do a project in.
2. Email or contact a suitable academic listed in 'Research Strengths' section on the previous page, or from the 'People' submenu to the left, to check whether they will be offering a project, or will be available to supervise a project for the times you intend to come.
3. Check whether your institution has an active Study Agreement in place with this Discipline of Pharmacology, or more generally The University of Adelaide; this will greatly facilitate your visit. The Pharmacology Department has formal exchange agreements in place with a number of overseas institutions.
4. Contact Daniel Place (daniel.place@adelaide.edu.au) to find out what you will need from the University to engage in a research study exchange. Students are advised that the preferred method of exchange is via a Confirmation of Enrolment (COE), rather than an occupational training visa. The training visa may not guarantee student status while in Australia.

Students will often need to demonstrate basic competency in English language and have a satisfactory insurance arrangement from their home institution in place.
