The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Research Foundation Scholarships 2010

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital (TQEH) campus, of the Central Northern Adelaide Health service (CNAHS) on Woodville Road, Woodville South, has a substantial research base, with a number of University Department and Hospital Unit research arms forming the Basil Hetzel Institute (BHI). Through its teaching and research affiliation with the University of Adelaide and University of South Australia, TQEH provides valuable basic and clinical research training opportunities at its site. A new purpose built research facility on the campus opened in December 2008, with modern laboratories and office accommodation to house the current research group.

The Basil Hetzel Institute (BHI) is committed to expanding the pool of research scholars at TQEH. As an incentive to attracting students, the BHI offers three types of scholarships funded by TQEH Research Foundation and Program Grants, as outlined below:

Scholarship - Vacation (a number are available in 2010)

This Scholarship scheme is an application-based, competitive program that enables undergraduate students with research promise to gain research experience under the supervision of a staff member of the University of Adelaide or University of South Australia or a hospital staff member affiliated with one of the universities in South Australia.

Scholarships are tenable for the full-time equivalent of a minimum of six weeks and a maximum of eight weeks. Students have the option of splitting the scholarship such that some of it may be conducted part-time and some of it full-time, on the condition that this is negotiated with the supervisor and communicated to TQEH Research Secretariat.

Eligibility: The Vacation Scholarship is designed for undergraduate students who have completed at least two years of their program. A student can only hold a TQEH Research Foundation Vacation Research Scholarship (or equivalent) if they do not simultaneously hold another vacation scholarship.

Duration: six to eight weeks
Value: stipend of \$200 per week

Scholarship - Honours (a number are available in 2010)

The Scholarship scheme is a competitive, application-based scheme that supports students with research promise to undertake an Honours degree at an institution of higher education.

Eligibility: Students must be eligible to enrol in an Honours Degree with any University in South Australia. A student can only hold a TQEH Research Foundation Honours Research Scholarship if they do not simultaneously hold another Honours Scholarship.

Any research of a collaborative nature with University Departments outside of TQEH or with other organisations will need terms and conditions to be documented in a research agreement and attached to the Scholarship application.

Duration: 12 months

Value: stipend of \$3,000 - \$7,000 per annum (+\$1,000 departmental maintenance allowance)

Postgraduate scholarships from external organisations

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Research Foundation Scholarships 2010

Scholarship - Postgraduate (are number are available in 2010)

The Scholarship scheme is an application-based, competitive program that enables postgraduate students with research promise to undertake a higher degree at an institution of higher education. Subject to certain conditions, Masters degree candidates may study for a maximum of two years, and PhD students for three years.

In addition to the application-based process, top-up scholarships will be offered to any scholar awarded an APA scholarship from the Universities of Adelaide, South Australia or Flinders who commences full-time postgraduate research at the TQEH in 2010.

Eligibility: Students must be a medical graduate eligible for registration in South Australia, or appropriately qualified science graduate or health professional eligible for enrolment in a university higher degree, and meet citizenship and residency criteria.

Any research of a collaborative nature with university departments outside of TQEH or with other organisations will need terms and conditions to be documented in a research agreement and attached to the Scholarship application.

Closing date: 30 October 2009

Duration: three years (Postgraduate), two years (Masters)

Value: Australian Postgraduate Award (APA) rate for 2010 (2009 stipend \$20,427 pa) + \$1 000 departmental maintenance allowance pa.
