The Postgraduate Structured Program has two components

- The *Core Component* involves attendance by all incoming students at a weekly series of seminars throughout Semester I and beyond. Please note also that the Core Component includes attendance at School Research Seminars, generally on Thursdays within semesters from 12.10-1 pm in Room 526, although there are some exceptions, as detailed below.
- The *Development Component*, which extends for the duration of candidature. It may include continuing training beyond the initial Semester 1 series of seminars, for example additional work for individual students to prepare them for their research. It may also include opportunities to undertake additional training relevant to future professional development.
