**Please Note:**

1. This list is organised into two parts, Part A: Approved Health Sciences Courses (compulsory and elective), and Part B: Approved Elective Courses from Other Faculties and Schools.
2. Inclusion of a course from another Faculty or School on the Acceptable Courses List does not guarantee that it is timetable compatible with core Health Sciences courses.
3. In some circumstances, students may be permitted to study courses not on this list, subject to obtaining written permission from the coordinator of the course involved, and approval from the BHLthSc Program Manager, (TBA) prior to enrolling into the course.
4. In the list of acceptable courses, each course has a hyperlink to the Course Planner. However, for some courses that are available in two or more teaching periods, hyperlinks have not been given for all options.
5. The unit value of all level I and II courses and most level III courses is 3 units. (Note: A small number of level III courses are 6 units in value). A standard full-time load is 24 units per year (12 units per semester).
6. Enrolment into any course is subject to the student having the appropriate prerequisite or background knowledge as indicated in Course Planner (<https://access.adelaide.edu.au/courses/search.asp>). Students who do not meet this requirement must contact the coordinator of the course concerned to seek permission to enrol.
