You are invited to participate in the research project described below.

# What is the project about?

You have been selected at random for inclusion in a major survey of dental health in Australia — the **National Dental Care Survey**. The purpose of the Survey is to obtain information about the frequency of dental problems in the community, and the types and sources of dental care received. The information, which will be collected from 8,000 people aged 5 years and over, will help us to develop priorities for dentistry, and contribute towards planning dental services across Australia. We are therefore seeking your assistance to ensure that a representative sample of people contribute to the survey.

#### Who is undertaking the project?

This survey is being conducted by the Australian Research Centre for Population Oral Health (ARCPOH) at the University of Adelaide in collaboration with the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care. You have been sent this information by Services Australia on behalf of the Department of Health and Aged Care and the research team. Services Australia is not involved or otherwise associated with the Survey and your personal details have not been released to us.

#### Why am I being invited to participate?

You have been randomly selected as part of a representative sample of people aged 5 years and over living in Australia. If you do not wish to participate, you do not need to do anything. However, you may receive up to 3 reminder letters which you can simply disregard. #### What am I being invited to do?

You are being invited to complete the survey online, over the phone or via a paper questionnaire (based on your preference).





# How much time will my involvement in the project take?

The survey should take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

# Are there any risks associated with participating in this project?

There are no foreseeable risks associated with participating in the survey.

# What are the potential benefits of the research project?

The information you provide during this survey will be used to develop new policies and programs to target population groups of most need and to monitor the utilisation of existing programs. Survey results will help in the planning of future dental services.

#### Can I withdraw from the project?

Participation in this Survey is completely voluntary. Even if you agree to participate, you can withdraw from the survey at any time during the data collection phase. If you choose to withdraw from the survey, it will in no way affect any entitlements for dental care that you may have with your State/Territory public dental service.

## What will happen to my information?

All information collected will be strictly confidential. Information will be stored securely and can only be accessed by the research team. Findings of the survey will be published in the form of reports, journal articles and conference or local presentations. Published results will not include your name or any information that could identify you. Your information will only be used as described in this participant information sheet and it will only be disclosed according to the consent provided, except as required by law.


