...improving the wellbeing of children and families vulnerable to child abuse and neglect by identifying and promoting early intervention and prevention programs & services <u>that work</u>.

EIRD will use best evidence to

- provide advice to government regarding best early intervention.
- consider policy and funding frameworks and make recommendations that maximise benefit of government \$.
- reflect the priorities of government, and will <u>prioritise across-government</u>, <u>multidisciplinary</u> efforts.
- focus on early intervention and research that will improve child protection <u>outcomes for Aboriginal children</u>.








Findings to date – Implications for Practice

Children experience the risks of adults in their life......

- Family vs child thinking
 - Family size/composition;
 - 280 families = 8000+ notifications



- Key factors influencing <u>repeat contact</u> with CP system
 - 1-49 in 6 months; 1-118 over 8 years;
 - 9% = 29%
 - Impact of family thinking
- Screening because we <u>can</u> or because we <u>should</u>?


