Enrolment Order

You need to enrol into your courses in the following order to ensure that you do not have any timetable clashes. Follow links in your <u>Study Plan</u> to view course/class information in <u>Course Planner</u>. All enrolment occurs through <u>Access Adelaide</u>. **Enrol into Semester 1 prior to Semester 2. Enrolment in all courses is compulsory.**

Semester 1 Order:

- MEDIC ST 2101A Scientific Basis of Medicine II Part 1. Enrol into workshop, choose resource session, and the lecture class.
- 2. MEDIC ST 2102A Clinical Practice II Part 1. Enrol into a clinical class and the lecture class.
- 3. MEDIC ST 2103A Medical Professional & Personal Development II Part 1. Enrol into lecture, choose one practical, and one tutorial class.
- 4. MICRO 2506 Medical Microbiology and Immunology II. Enrol into lecture, choose one tutorial class.
- 5. MEDIC ST 2000A Second Year Examination Part 1. Select available class.

In total, 5 enrolments for Semester 1.

Semester 2 Order:


- 1. **CLOSED ELECTIVE** The list of available electives is found on the Study Plan. Please be aware that there are some electives which will clash with components in MBBS. Please see the note below on resolving timetable clashes.
- 2. MEDIC ST 2101B Scientific Basis of Medicine II Part 2. Enrol into workshop, choose one tutorial, and one resource. You will be auto-enrolled into the lecture class.
- 3. MEDIC ST 2102B Clinical Practice II Part 2. Enrol into a clinical class and the lecture class.
- 4. MEDIC ST 2103B Medical Professional & Personal Development II Part 2. Enrol into lecture, choose one practical class.
- 5. MEDIC ST 2000B Second Year Examination Part 2. Select available class.

In total, 5 enrolments for Semester 2

If you enrol into a class that clashes with other classes or courses you are already enrolled in, an error message will be displayed along with the clashing class numbers and an enrolment request ID.

Please attempt to resolve this by ensuring you have followed the enrolment advice above, or choose a different class for one that is clashing. For enrolment issues you cannot resolve yourself, please lodge the relevant enrolment form (eg. Timetable clash resolution, course/class full, course add late, amendment to enrolment).

When enrolling please make note of the locations of all of your classes, as locations are in the Adelaide Health and Medical Sciences (AHMS) Building and also on Main Campus. You need to allow for time between classes to travel between AHMS and Main Campus, as applicable.
